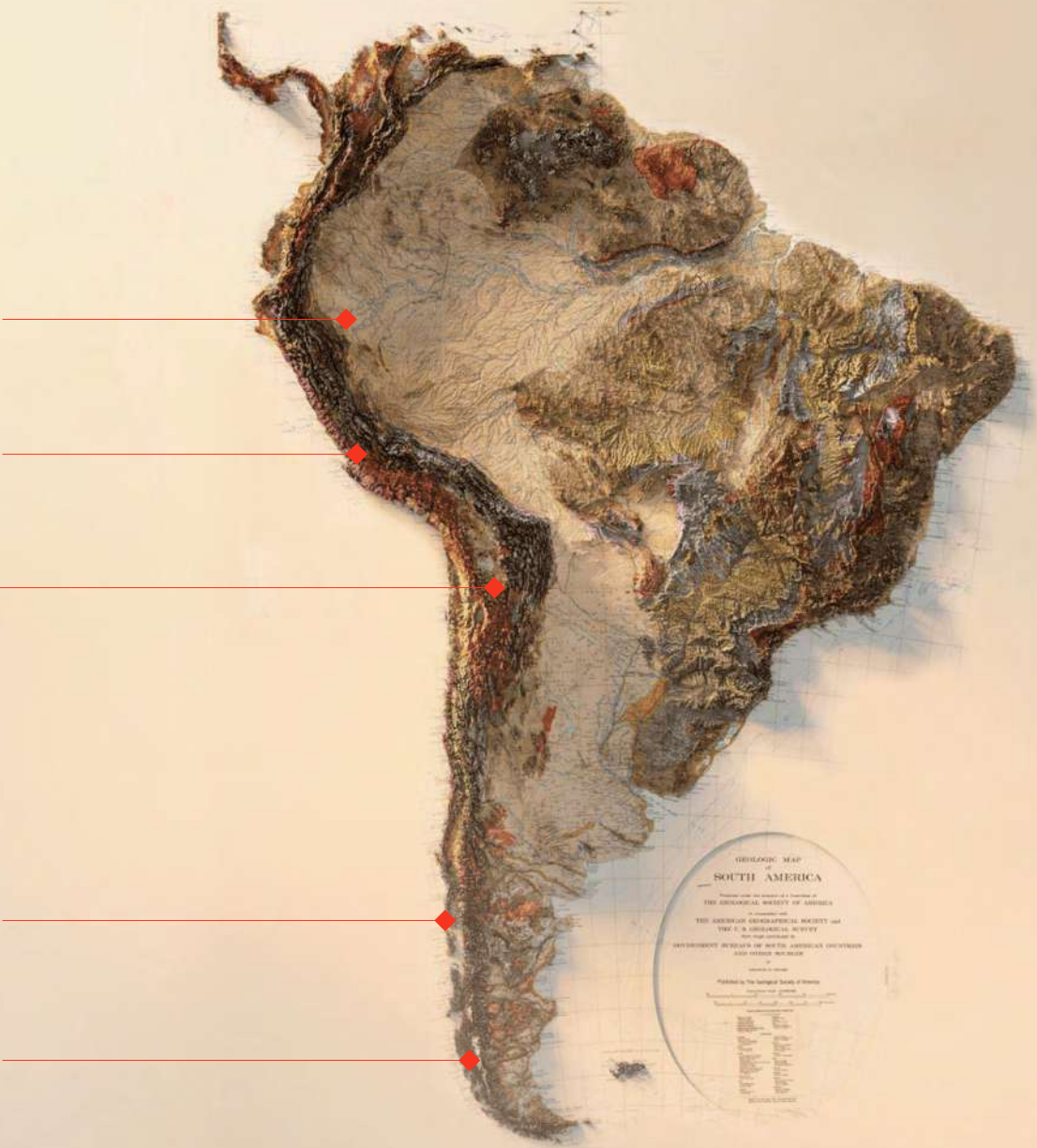

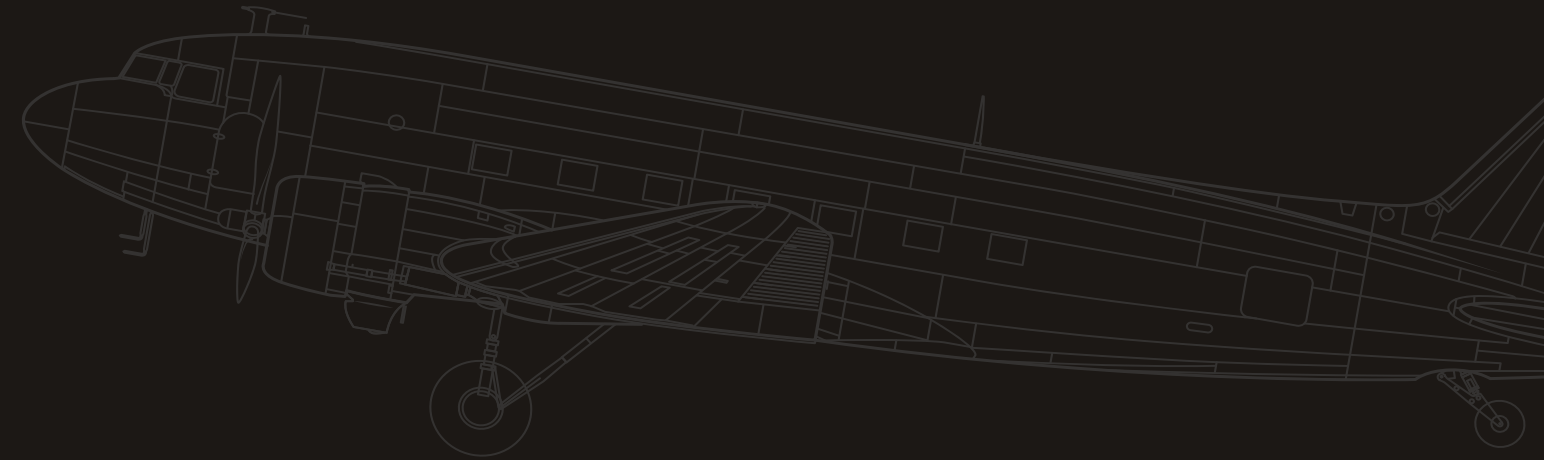


Where FEW have GONE BEFORE...

Each year, our aircraft make a grand traverse from northern Canada to Antarctica for the start of our polar season. During these low-level positioning flights, we witnessed some of the most spectacular scenery South America had to offer; pristine jungles, vast deserts and iridescent blue ice caps.

Because our aircraft can land on remote airfields, the idea came to us to link each of these hard-to-reach locations in one, seamless journey. Far from crowded airports and big cities, we fly direct to these hidden gems with no transfers, overnights or long airport queues. The experiences are hard to reach by any other means, taking us to truly remote destinations that are just brimming with adventure.





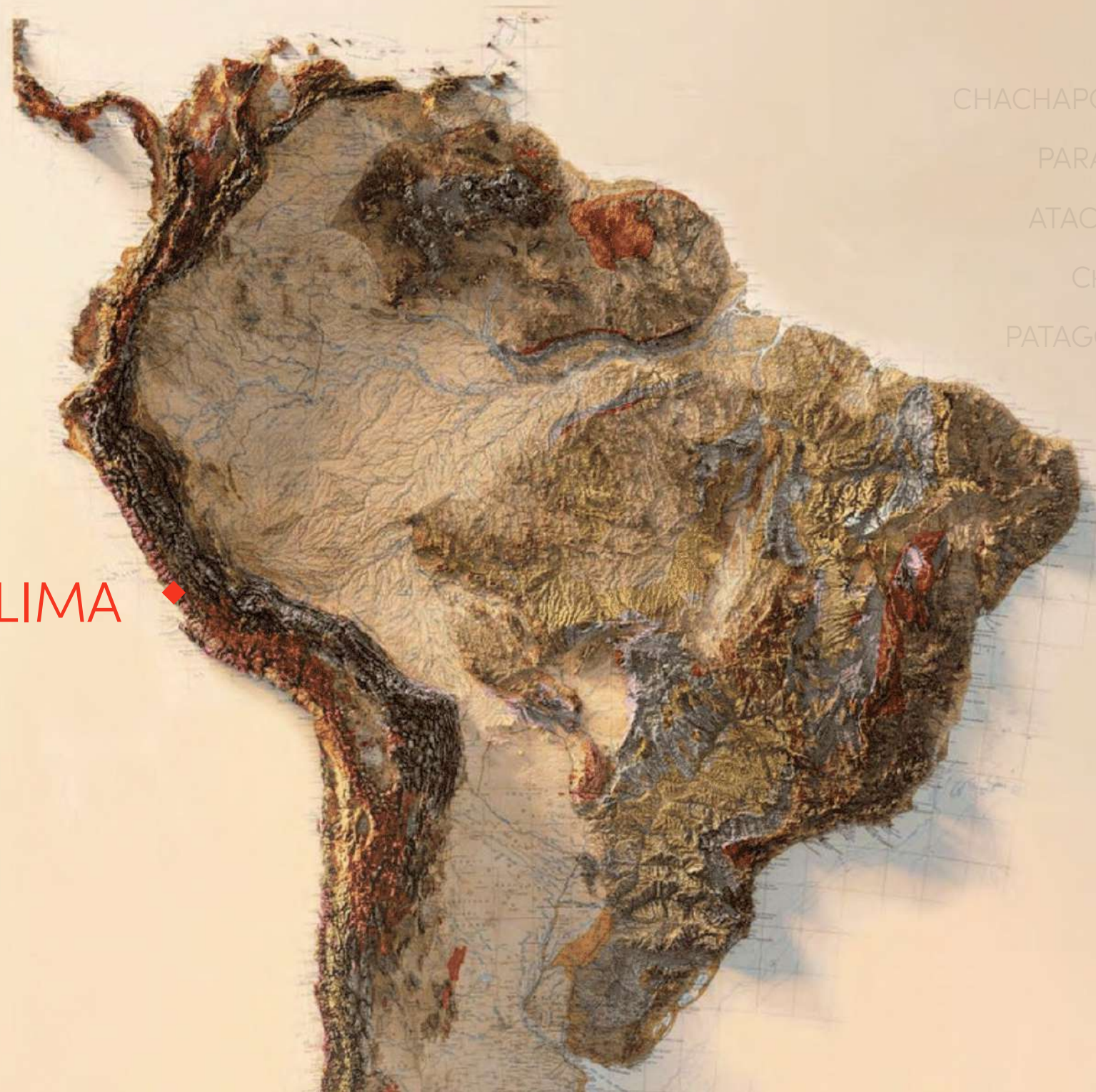
Old Airframe – New Aircraft

The aircraft we are using is the iconic DC3 from the 1940s. While the aircraft has all the retro style of its era, it has undergone an \$10 million conversion in the USA. The transformation included turbo-prop engines, the latest avionics and an array of modern safety systems.

The interior is a unique design that transports you back in time. It tells of when people dressed up to travel and flying was considered a glamorous affair. This was a time when the journey was as much about how you travelled as to where you were going.



Gocta Nature Reserve

3 nights





Deep in the cloud forests of northern Peru, Gocta Nature Reserve lies in the shadow of one of the world's tallest waterfalls. At 2000ft high, this waterfall is 'only' the 3rd highest in South America, meaning tourists seldom bother to visit it

Originally a reforestation project, it offers a serene escape to experience Gocta's natural beauty with all of your senses.

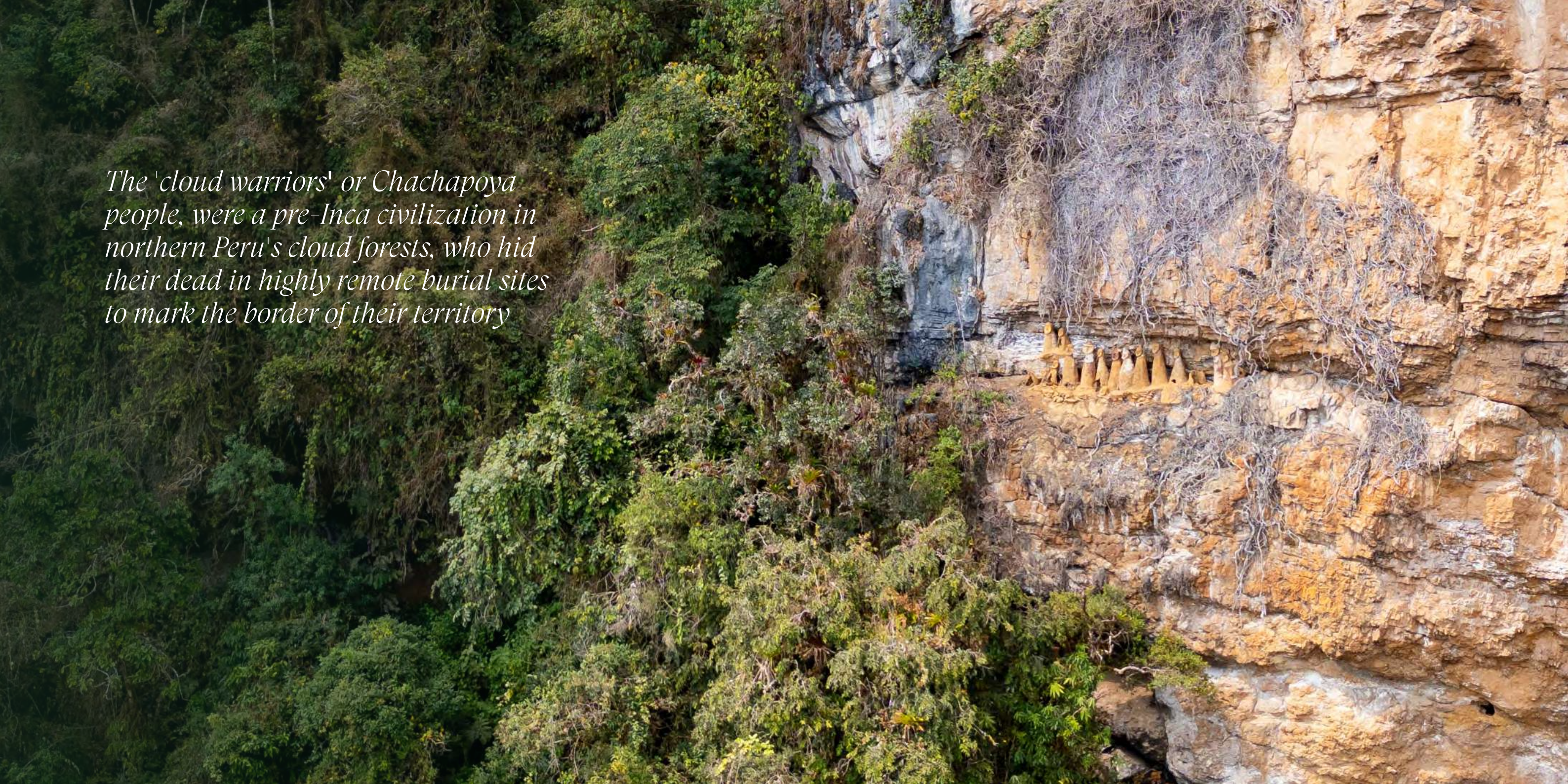
We go in search of the mummies of the Chachapoyan Indians

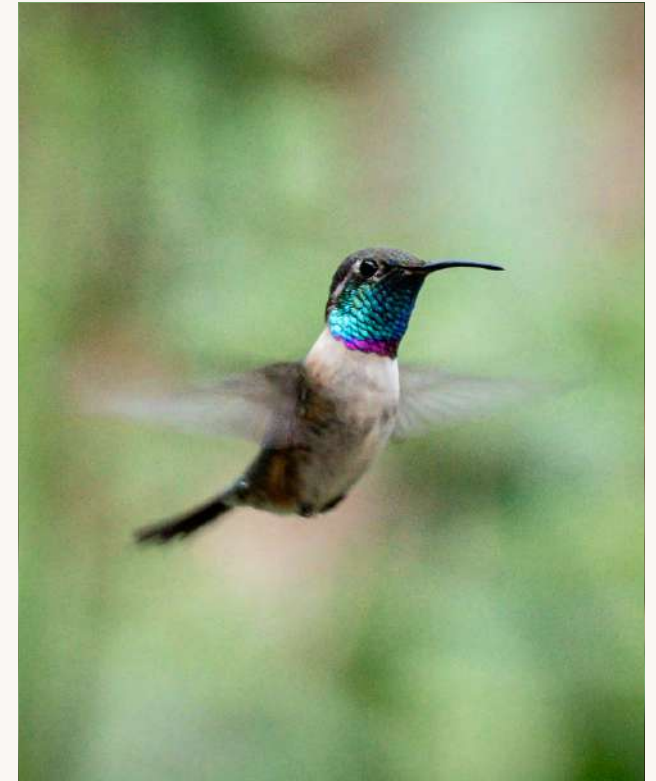

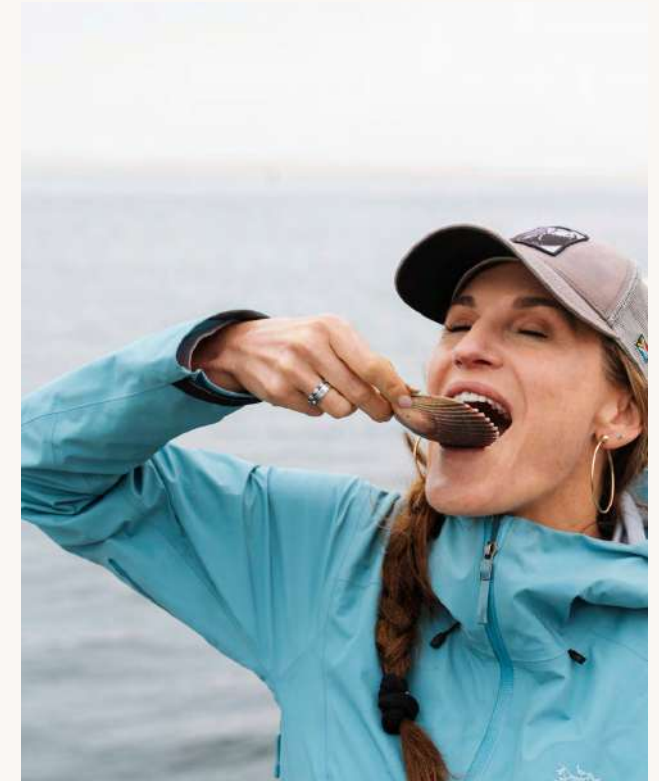

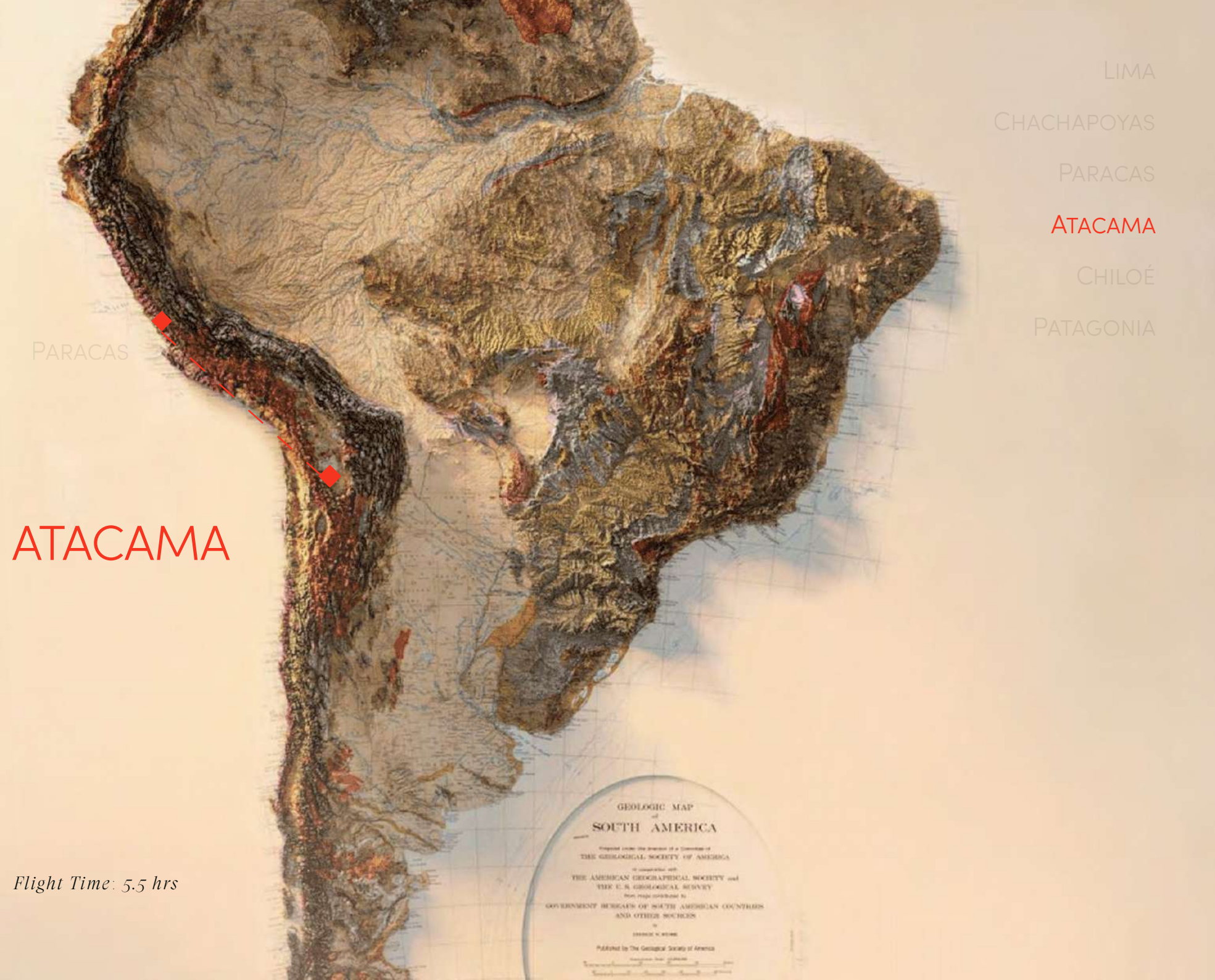
Mysterious and massive, the Nazca Lines are ancient geoglyphs etched into Peru's desert, revealing enigmatic shapes only visible from above.

Flight Time: 5.5 hrs

The lodge in Atacama is located in the oasis of San Pedro de Atacama, on the beautiful Ayllu de Larache.

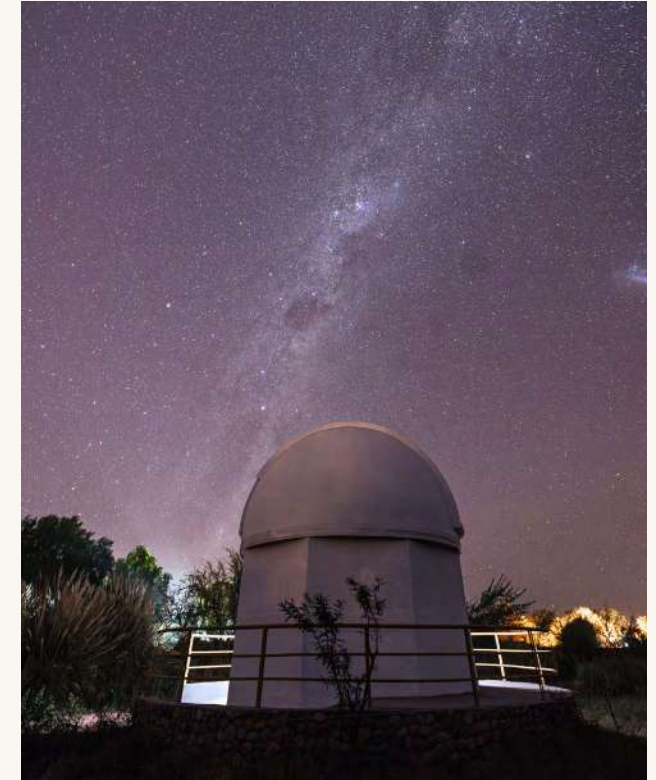
In the driest desert on Earth, Explora Atacama is a luxurious retreat where one can experience the desert's most dramatic features: salt-flats, volcanoes, hot springs and star-studded skies.

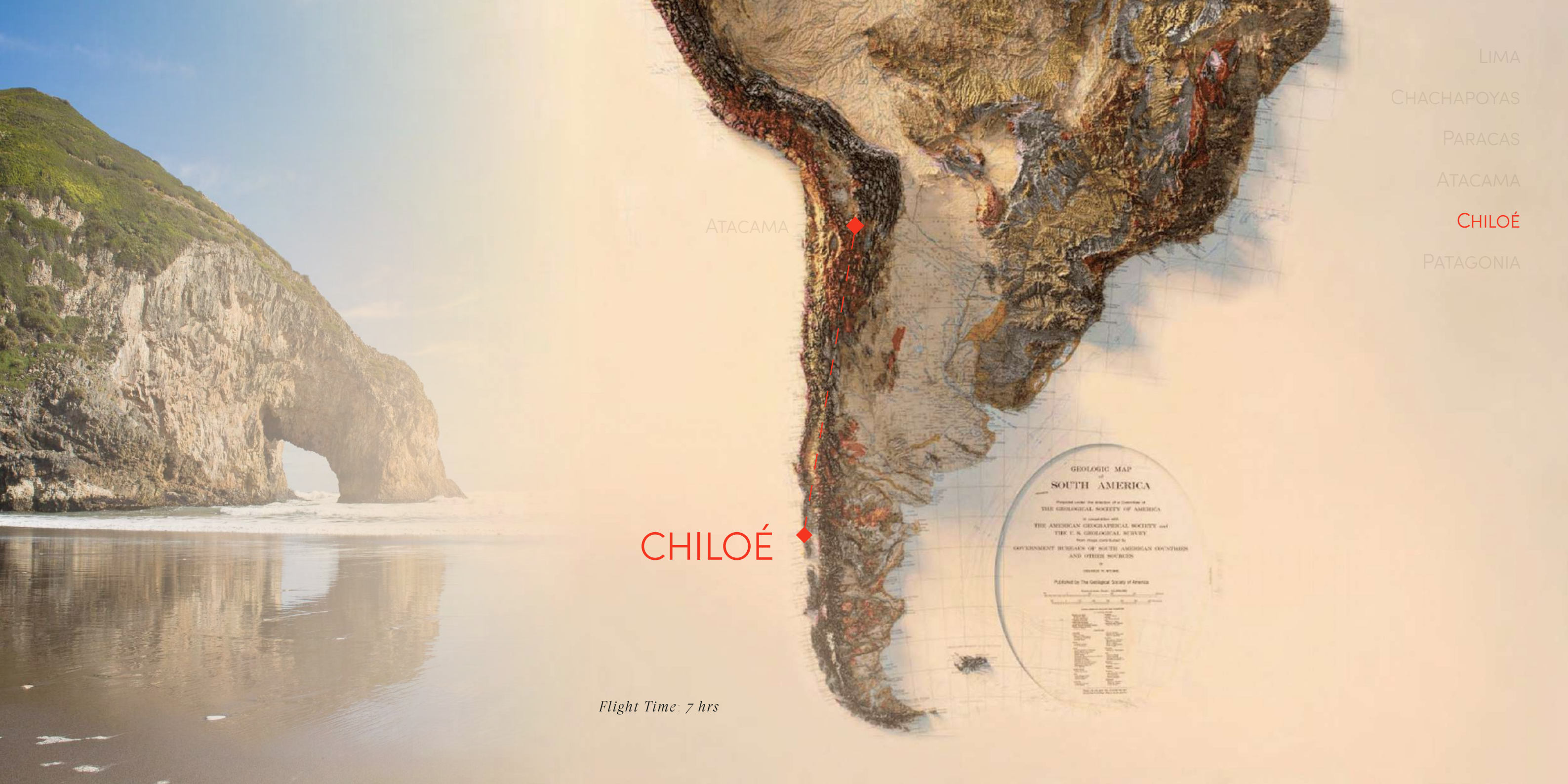


Float over the other-worldly landscape of the driest desert on earth

Tierra Chiloé

An architectural jaw-dropper inspired by traditional 'palafitos' or houses on stilts over the sea, this is an overnight stop on our way along the Chiléc coastline.



Perfectly positioned on expansive grounds overlooking Pullao Bay and the southern archipelago, Tierra Chiloé offers a gateway to a world where the cadence of nature and the enduring age-old island customs still hold sway.

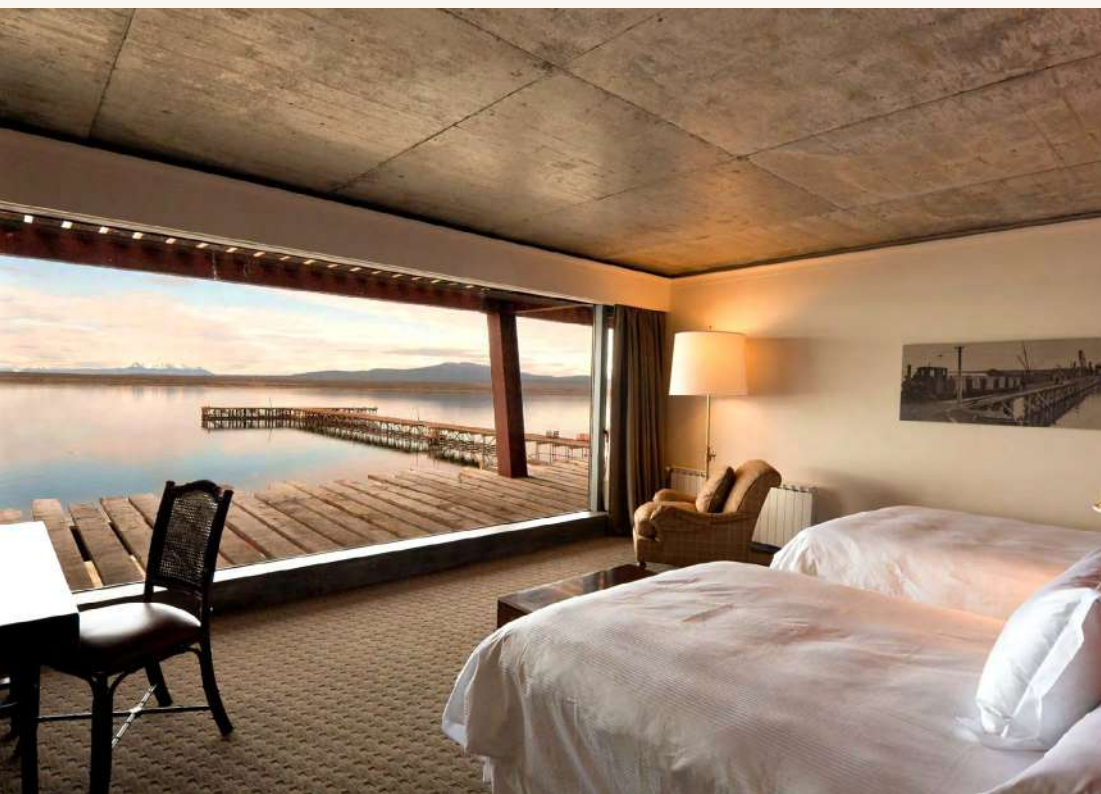
ACCOMMODATION
