THE FLIGHT

CAPE TOWN TO ANTARCTICA

The distance of 4,200km / 2,200nm will take approximately 5 hours. We pass from the African night sky into 24hrs of continuous sunshine, soaring over thousands of icebergs along the way. Destination: Wolf's Fang runway!

The Wolf’s Fang runway is sited on glacial blue ice which, when properly treated, is entirely suitable for business jets.

The 3,000m x 60m runway is maintained and operated by an experienced ground crew that attend to monitoring of weather, ground-to-air communication and runway grooming.

Weather forecasting and observation services are tailored to support planned flying operations and a daily briefing service is available for pilots departing Cape Town.

For the first time ever, you can now safely bring your personal aircraft to the last continent on earth.

As your pilot returns to Cape Town, you will be transferred by our DC3 Basler, call sign 'Mia,' to our luxury camp. Flight time 25mins.

Whichaway camp is totally unique and the perfect base from which to start your adventure.

There are six state-of-the-art sleeping pods that are heated and designed for two people in each. At just over 6m (20ft) in diameter, they are also spacious, with a writing desk, wash area and toilet.

For guests travelling separately, the room can be partitioned for privacy.



The rest of the camp comprises a shower pod, kitchen and three centralised pods that make up the reception, lounge and dining room. While the exterior is made from cutting edge materials, the interior has an old-world feel with rich textures. Here you can relax, enjoy the fantastic food from our award-winning chef and take things easy.

SUGGESTED ITINERARY

**DAY BEFORE
DEPARTURE**

White Desert will host a safety briefing in Cape Town. This is where we will check all your polar clothing and prepare you for your flight south.

DAY ONE

The flight to Antarctica is approximately 5hrs. Halfway through, we pass into the polar circle and 24hrs continuous daylight.

Once landed at Wolfs Fang runway, we spend the afternoon amongst kilometer high monoliths of rock, before connecting to Whichaway Camp.

At Whichaway, we will have a champagne picnic overlooking an immense icefall, followed by a gourmet dinner.

DAY TWO

Activities can be easy or adrenaline-fuelled. The choice is up to you...

We trek up nearby ‘Nunatak’ mountain - an easy climb, but offering spectacular views towards the coastline of Antarctica. We then visit irredscent ice tunnels that extend for hundreds of meters beneath the ice.

DAY THREE

We explore deeper into the Schirmacher Oasis - a rare stretch of terra firma surrounded on all sides by Antarctic ice cap - by visiting a nearby science base.

Meeting the scientists, we have unprecedented access to their ground breaking researvch.

DAY FOUR

After a hearty breakfast, we venture out in the 4x4s to an extraordinary cliff walk which overlooks surreal ice waves.

The trek is technically easy, but winding along a 200ft cliff face makes it seriously exhilarating.

That evening, we board the flight back home to journey once more into the heat of Africa.
